

# **Interoperability Network of the South Bay Strategic Plan**

## **Fiscal Year 2025-2026**

### **Introduction**

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The INSB Joint Powers Authority was established on April 26, 2017, for the purpose of constructing and operating an interoperable two-way radio communications system serving the southwest portion of Los Angeles County. The Joint Powers Authority was formed to govern the use of the shared communications infrastructure and provide for its long-term operation. It operates as a State of California Special District subject to the Ralph M. Brown Act (CA Gov. Code 54950 et seq.).

The fully interoperable, digital, simulcast, trunked system is comprised of 6 radio sites located within the South Bay area sharing 12 licensed radio channels. All 7 member agencies are capable of directly communicating to each other via “open” or Advanced Encryption Standard modes. The 6-site system is configured to simultaneously transmit radio traffic across all sites ensuring the broadest two-way radio coverage possible. System trunking and digital formatting makes possible the most efficient use of radio spectrum and improved user interoperability.

The INSB system operates in partnership with the Interagency Communications Interoperability System (ICI Systems) based in Glendale, CA to jointly provide service to 41 municipalities in the greater Los Angeles area. Additionally, the INSB and ICI Systems now interface into the Los Angeles – Regional Interoperability Communications System to provide extensive coverage throughout Los Angeles County.

INSB’s combined political jurisdiction is about 50 square miles serving a population of about 560,000 and responding to almost 500,000 calls for service each year. INSB’s extended operating area spans from LAX to Lomita and the Beaches to Alameda Corridor (about 100 square miles). There are about 2800 field deployable assets in the INSB member’s combined inventory operating via the shared radio infrastructure.
